



Ocean Film Festival, as always, had some amazing footage and the saying goes; "Always expect the unexpected in the unknown". 15 of us enjoyed dinner at Minsky's pub before heading across the road to the theatre.

The festival showed the World's most breathtaking ocean films from above and below the surface from Bodyboarding, swimming with whales, Aqua ballet (aquatic dancer that displayed amazing underwater artistry), surfing and marine conservation.

A gripping documentary - "White Rock" which was a description for Australia's Great Southern Reef where a devastating ecological crisis was folding as sea urchins decimate vital kelp forests. Divers were documenting the destruction offering hope by harvesting sea urchins and promoting them as delicious culinary option.

Another film called "Footprints on Katmai", Alaska, captured another type of plastic, shoes, that have ended up on the shores from around the world and how an artist had created "footprints" (sketches and water painting on the shoes that had been found). This film revealed how people leave profound marks on this pristine landscape without ever physically setting foot on its shores. Can't wait for the next edition of Ocean Film Festival next year.

Voting will be open from the Third week in May for two weeks.

The winner of the golden camera will be announced at the June Long Weekend trip to Port Stephens (7/8/9 June 2025).

Photo Competition Rules

- 1. All RUC members (full and social) are eligible to enter the competition
- 2. A current financial RUC member must have taken the photo
- 3. The entrant must be the creator of the image.
- 4. The entrant must own the copyright of the image.
- 5. The photographer grants Ryde Underwater Club Inc. publishing permission to reproduce the images in the Ryde Underwater Club Inc. website, club magazine (Surface Interval), Face Book page and in material promoting the club, including but not limited to a printed Calendar.
- 6. The photo was taken between 25th May 2024 and 10th May 2025.
- 7. The photo is received before 17th May 2025 by the Photography Sub-Committee EMAIL ENTRIES to spryb@ya-hoo.com
- 8. The photo is provided in electronic format:
- 9. JPEG format preferred.
- 10. Image size should be minimum of 3000 pixels by 2000 pixels at 300dpi and a maximum size of 4000 by 3000 pixels,300 dpi. Larger images may be accepted but will be re-sized to be consistent with all other entries.

- 11. File name includes initials of photographer, location and date it was taken, e.g. Nudibranch_John_Smith_-Colours_2023-12-09.jpg•
- 12. Some additional information about the photo (e.g. location and give your photo a title)
- 13. The photo does not necessarily have to be an underwater shot, but must be diving related
- 14. RUC members are invited to provide up to 10 photos (the first 10 photos received will be included but addition photos will be discarded)
- 15. Voting is for the top 5 photos
- 16. Points will be awarded to each image based on place voted by each member voting (i.e. 5 points for 1st place, 4 points for 2nd etc)
- 17. Entry with the most points is the winner (in case of draw, the photo with the most voters is the winner)
- 18. The decision of the committee will be final, and no discussion entered into regarding the winning entry.

The winner will become the proud caretaker of the Golden Camera until the next competition.

The first 15 places will have their photos printed in a Calendar, and the top three will receive a printed copy of their photos, in 8 inch x10 inch size. To all RUCPhotoites: get shooting and start putting aside your best shots aside for the photo comp!

February 9, 2025 - Shore Dive, Shelley Beach



The day and water was warm, with visibility up to 10m. We observed Wobbegongs, Coffin ray (Numb ray), flatheads, Spangled rays, Fidler Rays, school fish. There was even a Dusky whaler off in the distance. *Michael.P.*

February 20th, RUC had the honor of having Graham Willis, a keen diver and instructor from Frog Dive Sydney as guest speaker at the club's monthly meeting at the West Ryde Hotel. Gaham discussed his book; Dive Spots of NSW and the challenges he faced during Covid to get it published. He also discussed underwater photography and video, including the cameras and equipment he uses as well as sharing a number of tips to improve everyone's photos under the sea. February 22, 2025 - Club Boat Dive, Quarantine Bay, 20 meter.

A superb dive! Once the anchor was dropped near the reef, the team went down via the anchor and quickly found the massive reef filled with sponges and colours as far as the eyes could see. It was very dark at this depth so the torch was critical but we could still see each other from a 4 meter distance (but not more!). We kept an easy course at the same depth of 18 meters and then turned around at 'tank half way' point. Ken dutifully carried the reel and started reeling it in again (pretty awesome as would have been hard to find the boat in the darkness otherwise). At the end I ended up with the reel and realized what an amazing job Ken did because i struggled! Reeling ourselves back to the anchorline my hands got sore from the turning, and finally Bruce finishes the job for me (thanks!!!). Hanging at the anchorline at 18 meter

I suddenly felt cold and couldn't see the boat, just the line going up to the dark and had a moment of having to focus on my breathing before going up. From there, the sun slowly showed itself and the dark shape of the boat became visible. All relaxed at the 5 meter line we paused and got to say goodbye to the gorgeous warm water at 22 degrees for the entire dive. Coming up was a breeze with the great ladder and holds, and we are thankful for the great care of our skipper Wayne.

After our dive we motored to a sunny sheltered spot for muffins and coffee. What a treat! After feeling the cold down below I devoured the muffin in seconds and our bodies got warm again in the sun. Nothing better than seeing the beautiful harbour shine from a little boat. When it was time to get back it was seeing goodbye to an amazing morning with stunning underwater life. Lessons learned for me: check weights before you roll back. Check weights again when you are waiting for others to come. Don't check weights when you want to go down! thankful I could get back in the boat quickly, get the weights and roll



back again. That rolling backwards is so much fun I just had to do it twice! Thanks everyone on board for an amazing morning and hope you will have me again on board soon! *Annemarie*
